


#### Population

Ramsey County and Hennepin County together account for almost exactly half of the 15-county MSA's population.

At 550,200 people, Ramsey is the 2nd most populous county in MN and the 123rd most populous in the US.

...But it is the 30th densest in the country!





### **Population Density**


But total population doesn't tell a complete story, for even though it is much smaller in total population than Hennepin County, it is much more densely populated.

In fact, Ramsey County is the most densely populated county in the state and among the densest in the country.

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










### **Household Income**

Households in **Ramsey County** have slightly higher levels of income than the US at large, but relatively lower levels than elsewhere in the state and metro area.

Relatedly, the **cost of living** in the area, though lower than many urban areas, is higher than the US average, with goods and services on average cost about 2% more than US average.



Despite slightly higher household income, poverty in ramsey is slightly higher than in the US at large.


Poverty in Ramsey County is also much more pronounced than in Hennepin or the remainder of the Metro Area.





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

#### Change in Poverty since 2000





#### Poverty by Municipality






# Race and Ethnicity

Ramsey is also demographically similar to the United States.






# Housing












# **Ramsey Employment by Industry**

2010 and 2018









#### **Child Care**

The MIT Living Wage calculator assumes an annual cost for a single child of **\$7,883 annually** for child care in Ramsey county (but this is based on the assumption that low-income families will choose the cheapest option available in the area).

*Economic Policy Institute* has conducted a more rigorous study of child care costs around the country and found that the average cost in Minnesota for child care for a four-year-old is **\$12,252 annually**—fourth highest of all states.

#### Child Care Cost as a Percentage of Income For a median family in MN




That's over one-fifth of median pre-tax family income in MN. (HHS suggests 7% represents the threshold of affordability.)


Hennepin County County In Ramsey County workers earn less than their regional counterparts.





### **Economic Competitiveness Framework**

There is no single recipe for economic success, however, we have found that there are five critical ingredients for vibrant and sustainable communities: Investment, Talent, Sustainability, Place, and Diversity.




- Investment: a productive regional economy with active businesses that have access to the capital, markets, and workforce they need to grow
- **Talent**: a skilled workforce, with access to education that prepares residents to participate in the local economy
- Sustainability: a resilient community and economy with diverse industries, sustainable infrastructure, and a healthy population
- Place: an active and affordable community with high levels of civic engagement and a variety of quality of life assets
- Diversity: an equitable community, where diverse economic activity is reflective of a diverse population

### **Live-Work Analysis**




Most people who work in Ramsey County live somewhere else, and most employees who live in Ramsey County work somewhere else.

The "live-work" population represents only 17.6 percent of the total resident and employee workforce.









### Rent

Rents in Minnesota are increasing mare sharply than rents elsewhere in the country, and Ramsey has seen a similar rate of increase to the state over the last five years. However, Hennepin County has seen more significant increases than Ramsey County.




A **housing cost burden** refers to a household paying more than 30% of its income in housing costs (including rent/mortgage, utilities, insurance, etc.). Above this threshold, housing is considered unaffordable.

Despite relatively low rents and relatively low rates of rental increase in the last five years, **Ramsey County has a higher rate of housing cost burden** among its rental population than the rest of the region.





### **Transportation**



Average Vehicles per Person

Ramsey County has a low number of vehicles per person and a lower share of commuters driving to work than the MSA, Minnesota, and the U.S. However, despite having fewer vehicles per person than Hennepin County, it has more driver commuters.










Early Childhood Enrollment



Education Attainment by Race and Ethnicity






Despite a strong education sector, Ramsey has a lower percentage of African-Americans and Asians with Bachelor's degree versus the U.S.














The region's economy has a very similar mix of goods-producing (as opposed to service-providing) activity among private businesses. This level of industry diversity is a positive marker for economic sustainability.




### **Life Expectancy**


### **Extreme Heat**

Factors for extreme heat vulnerability include:

- Heat island effect
- Reduced air quality
- Distance to cooling centers
- Distance to emergency medical services
- Distance to hospitals

Considers location of most vulnerable populations to extreme heat - Age 65+ living alone, 300% below the poverty line, living in multifamily housing units

## **Changes in Precipitation**

### Flooding

Most vulnerable population: limited English proficiency, over 65 living alone, and those in extreme poverty

- Minnesota experienced a total of 860 flash flood from 1996 to 2013.
- Between 2010 and 2013 flash floods in Minnesota caused 13 deaths, almost \$13 million in crop loss, and over \$134 million in property damage (MDH)




Flooding in Minnesota caused over \$134 M in property damage from 2010-2013

Taking into consideration those most vulnerable to poor air quality (outdoor workers), asthma hospitalizations and COPD hospitalizations


#### Map of Extreme Air Quality Impacts






### **Renewable Energy**

With a total of **254.5 MW** of large-scale renewable capacity installed in Ramsey and its neighboring counties, the region has 0.46 KW per capita, far less than the US at .72 KW per capita.
